




## PARENT & PUPIL GUIDE – Finding and opening an assignment

You usually start from the last page you looked at, you need to click on assignments:



This will take you to the Assignments page, as you can see we only have one assignment to do today and it has to be handed in by the end of tomorrow so let's get started. Click on the assignment name:



You should see a page with the details of the assignment, lets look at what is there. You have the title, instructions and a file to look at. Click the file to see what is on there.

The article includes a quote from Grylls: "When Giles descended and I found myself alone so high up I was feeling a lot more vulnerable but I knew the weather and wind conditions were perfect. It was so amazing to look into Nepal, India and Tibet and all of a sudden these great Himalayan giants looked so tiny. It was a very special moment when I realised that there was no mountain in the world above me, especially after having stood on the top of the world myself nine years ago."
