EXPRESSIVE ART AND DESIGN

Children will use and explore a variety of materials, tools and techniques, experimenting with colour, design, texture, form and function. They will mix colours and shades and add materials to change the texture of paint. EXPRESSIVE ART AND DESIGN

Children retell familiar stories with other children and use small world props and environments to help develop their own narratives in their play with other children. Children will use paints, collage, felt pens amongst other media to explore colour and design.
